

Blacktown Fayre

Saturday 21 May

A fighting demonstration was held under the noontide sun, which included a "last man standing" battle with around a dozen fighters. Saturday 30 July

Late in the evening, seven performers took the stage for a bardic competition. We enjoyed a variety of humorous songs, period tunes, sing-alongs and poetry.
